GUIDELINES FOR PAPER PRESENTATION COMPETITION

1. Eligibility & Team Size:

- The competition is open to teams of **2 to 4 members**.
- All participants must carry their **college ID card** for verification.

2. Registration & Submission:

- Participants must register in advance within the given deadline.
- A soft copy of the paper must be submitted before the event for initial screening. Late submissions may not be accepted.

3. Presentation Guidelines:

- Each team/participant will get **5-10 minutes** to present, followed by **2-3 minutes** for Q&A.
- Presentations must be in **PowerPoint (PPT/PDF format)** and should be submitted on a **USB drive or emailed in advance**.
- The use of charts, graphs, and visuals is encouraged to enhance clarity.

4. Paper Format & Topics:

- The paper must follow a **standard IEEE/APA format** with clear sections: Abstract, Introduction, Methodology, Results, Conclusion, and References.
- The topic must be **relevant to the given themes**. Plagiarism will lead to disqualification.

5. Code of Conduct:

- Participants must maintain **professional decorum** and adhere to the time limit.
- Any form of **plagiarism, misrepresentation, or disruptive behavior** will lead to immediate disqualification.

6. Technical & General Instructions:

- Participants must report **30 minutes before** their scheduled presentation time.
- A projector will be provided, but participants should bring their own laptop a backup of their presentation.
- Mobile phones must be kept **on silent mode** during the event.

The decision of the judges will be final and binding. Best of luck to all participants!



Project Competition

GUIDELINES FOR PROJECT COMPETITION

1. Eligibility & Team Size:

- The competition is open to **teams of 2 to 4 members**.
- All participants must carry their **college ID card** for verification.

2. Registration & Submission:

- Participants must **register in advance** before the deadline.
- A brief **abstract** of the project (Most recent synopsis), including objectives, methodology, and expected outcomes, must be submitted before the event for initial screening.

3. Presentation Guidelines:

- Each team will get **10-12 minutes** to present their project, followed by a **3-minute Q&A session**.
- Presentations must include **problem statements, objectives, methodology, results, challenges, and future scope**.
- Teams may use **PowerPoint (PPT/PDF format)** for their explanation. A prototype or working model is mandatory.

4. Project Categories & Format:

- Projects must fall under or somehow align the given **technical domains** (e.g., AI, IoT, Mechanical Design, Software Development, etc.).
- Both **hardware and software projects** are allowed, but necessary arrangements must be made by participants for project demonstration.

5. Code of Conduct:

- Participants must maintain **professional behavior** and adhere to time limits.
- **Plagiarism, misrepresentation, or disruptive behavior** will lead to immediate disqualification.

6. Technical & General Instructions:

- Teams must report **30 minutes before** their scheduled presentation time.
- Participants must bring all **required components, software, and backup files** for their project.
- A **power supply, projector, and internet access** may be provided, but teams should confirm requirements in advance.
- Mobile phones must be kept **on silent mode** during the event.

The decision of the judges will be final and binding. Best of luck to all participants!
